

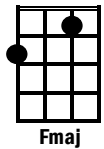
Michael Finnegan [F C (Am)] & taps

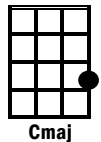
1. There [F] was an old man named Michael Finnegan

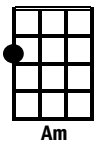
2. There [F] was an old man named Michael Finnegan
